Public Hearing on Proposed Development Agreement with Bailey Drive Estates, LLC

Mayor Behnken opened at 5:06pm.

Sports Complex Sponsorship Signage Request

City Manager Vick referred the Council to a memo from Parks & Recreation Director Doug Foley regarding the signage request at the high school baseball diamond at the sports complex. The Council reviewed the request and discussed the sign size, location, regulation, and future requests.

Motion by Bradley, seconded by Scherbring to approve the Sports Complex Sponsorship Signage Request from West Delaware County Community School District and Stryten Energy for a 12' wide sign to be located between the two beams on the scoreboard at the high school baseball diamond at the Beckman Sports Complex. Motion carried, all ayes.

Marketing/Communication Proposal - Sisters Marketing & Co

The Council discussed the proposal from Sisters Marketing & Co and the Council's goal to enhance communications with residents utilizing a variety of means. Following discussion, motion by Poynor, seconded by Schmitt to approve the proposal from Sisters Marketing & Co, excluding the Branding Revamp component, for a trial period of six months. Motion carried, all ayes.

Request for Special Exception to Livestock Restrictions

The Council reviewed a request from Anthony Bardgett to have chickens on the property at 713 Ridgewood Drive.

Motion by Scherbring, seconded by Schmitt to approve the special exception to livestock restrictions for Anthony Bardgett for the property at 713 Ridgewood Drive to allow for up to six chickens and no roosters on the property. Motion carried, all ayes.
