Shelly Park Redevelopment Project - Larry Kurtz, Align Architecture & Planning

Larry Kurtz, Align Architecture & Planning, reviewed preliminary plans for the Shelly Park Redevelopment Project with the Council. Items discussed included: removal of the cottonwood tree, terracing, lighting, shelter, cost estimate, stairs, walkway, plantings, and electrical service. Mr. Kurtz will finalize plans based on the discussions and bring back to the City Council for approval.

Aquatic Center Repairs

Parks & Recreation Director Doug Foley reviewed repairs needed at the aquatic center with the City Council. The repairs needed include replacement of the lily pads and anchors and concrete repair/patching. Following discussion, motion by Bradley, seconded by Poynor to approve the replacement of three lily pads and install five new anchors and hardware at a cost of \$8,730.50 and proceed with the concrete repairs and patching at the aquatic center. Motion carried, all ayes.

Request for Special Exception to Livestock Restrictions

City Manager Vick informed the Council that Bruce Ratzlaff, 1009 Sherman Avenue, has requested permission to have four chickens at his property.

Motion by Sherman, seconded by Schmitt to approve the request of Bruce Ratzlaff to have up to four chickens and no roosters at his property at 1009 Sherman Avenues. Motion carried, all ayes.

Motion to authorize the City Manager to sign the "FAA Airport Improvement Program Grant Agreement 3-19-0137-007-2022" for Acquisition of Land at the Manchester Airport

City Manager Vick informed the Council that approval of this grant agreement would provide grant funding which would cover 90% of the cost of the purchase of the property from Jim Hill adjacent to the airport.

Motion by Scherbring, seconded by Sherman to authorize the City Manager to sign the "FAA Airport Improvement Program Grant Agreement 3-19-0137-007-2022" for Acquisition of Land at the Manchester Airport. On call of roll: Ayes: Scherbring, Sherman, Poynor, Bradley. Nays: Schmitt. Motion carried.
